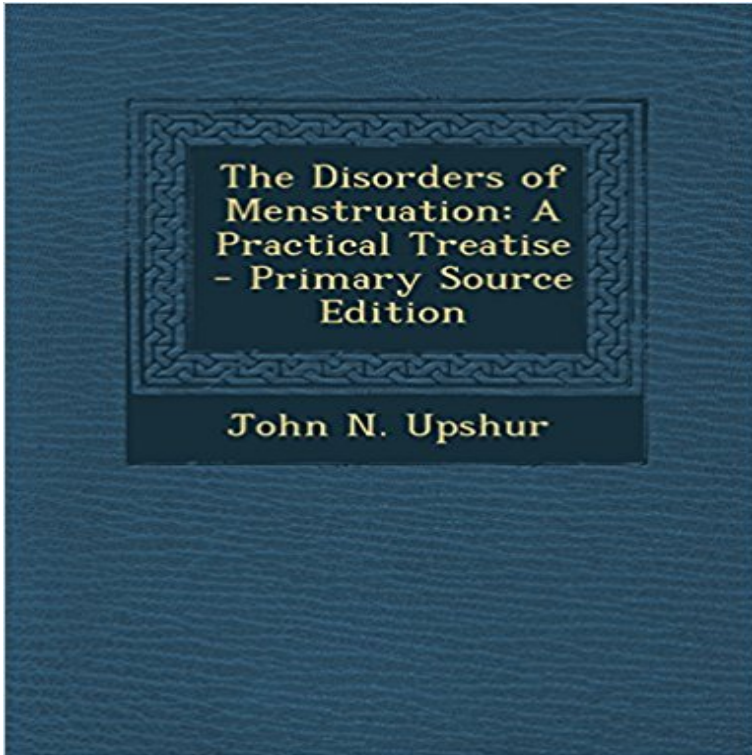


# The Disorders of Menstruation: A Practical Treatise - Primary Source Edition
